My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Next week we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, which is also known as the birthday of the Church, the new Israel and the new Eve.

The bible reveals to us that God's love for Israel is spousal. *Note carefully what I am saying.* I am not saying that God's love is as that of a spouse; I am saying it *is* spousal: he marries Israel. The Lord *is* Israel's husband; she *is* his bride. The same is true for Jesus and the New Israel, the Church. The Church *is* Jesus' bride; he *is* her husband. Jesus only has one bride: the Church; she has only one husband: Christ her Lord. Moreover, the Mass is the nuptial banquet of the Lamb of God with the Church. Yes, the love of Jesus for the Church and She for her Lord is consummated each and every time the Eucharist is celebrated. At each and every Eucharist Jesus gives himself completely—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—to his Bride. The Bride, gathered together at the Eucharist, gives herself completely to the Divine Bridegroom. That is why Blessed Pope John Paul II spoke of the Offertory as "normative" for every Mass; it symbolizes and actuates the complete giving of the assembly and of every member in it to Jesus, our Divine Bridegroom, just as husbands and wives do.

Long and short of all of this—the relationship of the Divine Bridegroom with the Church and the meaning of the Eucharist is most perfectly represented in the Church and in the world by marriage, that is, by the spousal union of one man and one woman until death do they part. For this reason, the Church encourages Catholics to date and marry other Catholics. And Catholics must be married in the Church or, if outside of it, with her permission. Catholics who do not marry in the Church or with the Church's permission to be married outside of it marry outside the Lord precisely because they marry outside the Lord's Bride, the Church. Therefore, persons who do so cannot take Communion in the Church until they have gone to sacramental reconciliation (Confession) and have had their marriage validated in the Church. That is also the reason why the divorced and remarried who have not had their first marriage(s) declared null also may not receive Communion at Mass. If you are married outside of the Church, I ask you not to receive Communion. If your children are married outside of the Church, I ask you to explain and ask them to refrain from Communion if they come to Mass. And I invite anyone in these situations to call me so that we can pray over the matter, talk about it, and consider how to open up oneself and one's marriage to the sacramental grace of the Eucharist and of marriage.

This weekend we say good-bye to Fr. Mbala, and thank him for his year of service to us. Father will be speaking at all of the Masses this weekend. However, please also stop by anytime Sunday morning to greet him and wish him well. And we wish Owen and Terri Vyner our best. Owen has been our director of marriage and family ministry for the last six years. The Vyner's are moving to Chicago so that Owen might complete his studies in sacramental theology. We will miss them both.

Finally, on another note, next week is Pentecost Sunday. Please wear red next week as a way of celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit and welcoming him into our community and into our hearts.
