

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MY FUNERAL

The passing of a loved one is one of the hardest things we face in this life. Frequently, funerals are handled in a rush and in a manner that sometimes does not reflect the wishes of the deceased, for the simple reason that family members often don't know the deceased's wishes. Pre-planning a funeral service serves to ensure that your wishes are known and relieves those whom you leave behind of the necessity to make arrangements for you.

You are invited to fill out these forms and request that the church and relatives keep them on file. Please do not put these forms in a safe deposit box for easy accessibility.

Because the Catholic Church holds the human body to be sacred, burial is the preferred treatment of remains. I would like my remains to be buried or interred in the following way: Buried in a cemetery plot Interred in a vault (above ground) Interred in a crypt (below ground) Interred in family mausoleum NOTES / THOUGHTS / OTHER PREFERENCES:	Because the Catholic Church holds the human body to be sacred, cremated remains should be kept together and buried or interred in a columbarium or mausoleum. Scattering cremated remains, dividing them among family members, or keeping the cremated remains in a loved one's home are not in keeping with Church teaching. Postponement of cremation until after the funeral service is also preferred. "This allows for the appropriate reverence for the sacredness of the body at the Funeral Mass: sprinkling with holy water, the placing of the pall, and honoring it with incense" (USCCB). It is also helpful for family members to be able to view the remains of their loved one prior to cremation. Many funeral homes offer a cremation casket which will be cremated with the body and can be used during the service. While having the bodily remains present for the funeral is preferred, it is not required. I would like cremation to be postponed until after the funeral service.
